

Invitation to Join the Conversation



Covid-19 has disrupted people's personal lives, family lives and financial security.

Our church communities have also been disrupted. Some have been open for worship for a month or so, some are just opening and some have yet to reach this point. One of our larger churches has a ministerial vacancy, another will have one soon and a third has welcomed a new priest this month. Nearly all fellowship activity has been curtailed. Online activity has increased but not everything we do lends itself to the online format and not everyone has online access.

It is our experience that the health crisis and lockdown have caused us to reflect on our lives and our faith and we wonder what the experience has been for others and where this may lead us.

This is an open ended discussion as we seek where the Spirit may be leading us.

We are inviting you and we hope you will invite others from your church to join the conversation starting from the question:

What has been your experience of lockdown and what have you learnt about your faith during this time?

Owing to current restrictions, the meetings will have to be via Zoom in groups of around 10 in number.

We anticipate that the discussion will be in English but we are also conscious that there are sometimes moods, feelings and faith understandings in Welsh that do not easily translate and we welcome these.
